

Enrolling as a student

Advantages:

- lower **mensa** prices (at least 1€ per dish)
- free GitHub Copilot
- free therapy (PBS)
- free public transport after 6pm and on weekends/holidays
- free **bike** for <30min rides (KVV nextbike)
- participation in elections for doctoral representatives in official boards
- non-EU doctoral candidates: helps with visum if the contract ends before PhD is finished
- further discounts (Amazon, Spotify Premium, cinema, museums, state theater,...)

Disadvantages:

- costs (200€ per semester for EU & non-EU students)
- paperwork...





KIT benefits




- KIT <u>library</u> (many online resources, paywall papers etc)

How to start your PhD

- 1. Fill out the <u>doctoral agreement</u> (<u>Promotionsvereinbarung</u>)
- 2. Register with KHYS via the Docata Portal
- 3. Apply for **PhD acceptance** at the dean's office at the faculty of physics
- Enroll as a doctoral student (optional if employed with a position > 50 %)
- 5. Enroll in one of the physics associated **graduate school** (if applicable)

How to end your PhD



- 1. Finish your **thesis** :)
- 2. Officially apply for <u>admission to the Doctoral Examination</u> and Opening of the Doctoral Procedure (Docata portal, then hand it in to the Dean's office)
- Oral Exam: There are 20 minutes to present your (most important) work, then 50 minutes of questions by your PhD Commission
- 4. **Publish** your dissertation within one year after the exam
